2- ESSENTIAL NOTES AND EXPRESSIONS

a new study reports that **active euthanasia** - in which not only is medical care withdrawn, but drugs are used to shorten life - is opposed by two third of British doctors... Even in

such secular, permissive countries as Sweden, doctors tell surveys they oppose euthanasia by large margins.

Daniel James was a British 23-years old who was paralyzed after being injured in a rugby match in 2007. He required the help of his parents to get to the Dignitas clinic in Switzerland where his **assisted suicide** took place in 2008. Under British law, assisting someone to commit suicide is a punishable offense. However, the director of the Public Prosecution decided that prosecuting Jame's parents would be against the public interest.

In April 2001, the Netherlands became the first European country **to legalize** euthanasia and assisted suicide. Since January 2002, stringent Dutch constitutions legalization has been in place, whereby regional euthanasia committees, made up of judges, medical and ethical professionals, assisted by a second medical opinion, can grant incurable patients' requests to have their life shortened by a medical expert.
